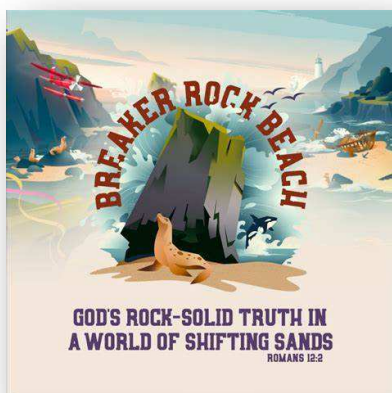
The Historic Liberty Hill A.M.E. Church held its 2024 Vacation Bible School from Monday, June 10 to Friday, June 14 (from 6:00 to 8:00 pm each day). The theme was "Breaker Rock Beach" focusing on Romans 12:2 with the sub-theme of "God's rock solid truth in a world of shifting sands."

The program was preceded by weeks of prayer and planning by the VBS team along with creative "live" announcements during the Sunday morning worship experiences. In May the official "Breaker Rock Beach" outdoor banner was set up in front of the church by the Trustees. On Saturday, June 8 posters were displayed and the Fellowship Hall and classrooms were decorated with the "beach" theme to set the atmosphere for the week.

The anticipation and excitement were evidenced each night as all attendees gathered in the sanctuary for a devotional period after which the

The lesson topics were:

Monday – Truth Comes from God (Genesis 2-3)

Tuesday – God’s Plan Is Best (Daniel 1)

Wednesday – Everyone Needs Jesus (Mark 10: 17-27)

Thursday – Jesus Is the Only Way (John 14: 1-6, 16-20; Acts 1: 9-12)



Friday – Speak the Truth in Love (Acts 9: 1-6, 19: 1-10, 21 -31; Eph. 3: 14-4:16)

Sessions included Bible study, arts and crafts projects (coordinated by Sis. Michaela Rutledge), and

other activities. Participants were given study guides and the adult students were assigned homework (!).

The closing of each evening included a review of the lesson (with representatives from each age group reporting) followed by a meal and snacks, prepared by the Kitchen Committee and assisted and served by many volunteers.

The highlights of the concluding fellowship on Friday evening were:

the special presentation of the song “I Will Follow You” by the younger children’s class (grades 0-2);

the display of the artwork done by the teen class;

the presentation of certificates of completion and gift bags to one and all; and

the (final) collection (of spare change) for the missions project “Water For Tanzania” (partnered with Empowering Lives International) geared to provide clean drinking water to villages in the East African country. A total of \$150. was collected.

CONGREGANTS TRIP TO “BULL STREET”

In the June 2024 YPD Special Edition, we highlighted Kendel Ragin and his Hollywood experience with the locally filmed movie **Bull Street**. There are several other Liberty Hill congregants that were involved with this film project. Brother Aaron Jones, Brother Evan Lawson and Brother Michael Richburg made cameo appearances during a funeral scene in the movie. Shiarya Ragin, PJ Ragin, and Latoya Dennison were filmed as extras.. However, some of those scenes were cut from the movie.

Sister Sharon Madison was behind the scenes for the project working as the “stand in” for the movie’s star, Ms. Loretta Devine. The following is an account of Sister Madison’s experience on the movie set.



Back in January 2022, Miss Shiayra Ragin posted that she was an intern for casting in a movie that was shooting in Summerton. But what captured my attention was that the movie was featuring my favorite actress, Lady Loretta Devine. I was like, “is this for

real?” I thought about it and made an inquiry to Shiarya about the validity of the post. She assured me that it was real. Since I’m a retiree and had some time, I decided to

email the casting director to put my name in the hat as an extra.

Karlie, the casting director, asked for some information and a photo. After I sent my photo, she immediately responded – “I have something a little more for you than an extra. How would you feel about being a stand in for Ms. Devine”. Naturally, I was so excited, but the question was, what is a “Stand-In”?



Karlie explained (paraphrased from Google) that a stand-in is a person who substitutes for an actor before filming for the purpose of setting up the scene’s lighting and camera setup. They are not stunt doubles or body doubles. The stand-in helps the camera department light the set, as well as

tweak their blocking, composition, framing, and focus. I won’t be in front of the camera; and that is fine with me. I will get to meet my favorite actress.



Karlie mentioned that since I had some of the same physical features as Ms. Devine, I would be perfect. Then she sent a photo with me and Ms. Devine side by side with the words “pretty close”.



When June 2022 rolled around, I got the call that filming would begin the following week. I was extremely excited, but nervous. The first day, I was to report to Clarendon District One Resource Center (the old Scott’s Branch High School). There, I would get the first of several COVID tests and report to wardrobe to be sure my attire would near match the colors my character, Big Gal, would be wearing. From the Resource Center, we travelled to set via shuttle. Along the way, we stopped at Summerton Baptist Church, where an RV was parked. Low and behold, when the door opened to the RV, there she was, Ms. Loretta Devine, in the flesh! I was immediately star struck. I could not move. This woman came on the shuttle and sat up front; and in that soothing Loretta Devine voice, she said “Good Morning”.



We travelled just a few yards to an older house down the Street from Summerton Baptist. When she got off the shuttle, I gasped. Everyone looked at me and thought I was getting sick. I said I was ok, I was just so elated to be in the presence of my favorite actress.

Thus began the next 10 days on the set of “Bull Street” for me as stand-in for Ms. Loretta Devine. Most days were in locations with no air and mosquitos. Filming was Monday through Friday for 12 hours each day. We did get lunch each day prepared by Sharon Thames’ company (Liberty Hill roots). The cuisine was delicious each day. I also discovered that at the set location was “craft services”, which was like a set canteen that provided plenty of refreshing water, other

drinks and snacks. There was a lot of sitting and waiting until your name was called. It was important to remain “quiet on set” when filming as the slightest sound would be picked up by the microphones and ruin the take (listen at me using “movie talk”).

My first act as stand-in was actually sitting-in. There were scenes where “Big Gal” was sitting in her living room chair watching TV and talking to her granddaughter, “Louester”. I had to sit in that chair while the crew set the lighting and camera angles. At times, they had to readjust the chair and place lifts under it so that the character can be captured correctly on film. After they perfected all of the setting, I got up and then Ms. Devine would come in and do her thing.

Most scenes would have to be repeated several times so that they could film the scene from different angles. The camera crew advised me that one of the keys to great movies took place in the editing room. After this experience, each time I watch a movie, I’m counting the angles of scenes to see how many shots they may have taken for that one scene. It is amazing.

I was in awe of Ms. Devine’s acting skills in person. Sometimes she would hum a tune before or after she delivered her lines. Y’all know she can sing! There were times she made me tear up; her acting was so real and so full of emotion.

The day shooting was off Liberty Hill Road, up the road a bit from Liberty Hill AME Church was extremely hot. The health professional on set constantly reminded us to stay hydrated. There were a few tents set up on the road, but the tents did nothing for 100-degree temperatures sitting in chairs on pavement.

A few times, I was stand-in for other actors. Like the cross-

burning scene. That was a miserable evening, as it was dusk and you know what happens in the South, in the summertime at dusk – mosquitos. No amount of insect repellant was helping either. I was so glad when that day was over. I was absolutely miserable that evening.

There were other film days that were quite pleasant – when we filmed at Taw Caw Baptist and the Courthouse in Manning. I was nervous when filming the funeral scene, though, because I knew “Big Gal” had to be in that casket. That was where I drew the line. I had already made up my mind that if I had to get in that casket, that would be the day I quit. Fortunately, Ms. Devine got in that casket herself. I was impressed because she laid there for what seemed like hours, like a trooper, until they finished filming the funeral scene.

At the end of my ten days, which was also the end of filming for Ms. Devine, Karlie asked if I wanted to continue as an extra in the movie and then I would be in front of the camera. After ten 12-hour days, I was through with my trip to Bull Street.

This was an exciting time in my life, and I was so glad I had the opportunity and time to do this. It was wonderful meeting my my sorority sister, Ms. Loretta Devine. She was one of the sweetest people I’ve met. She was not a movie set “Diva” at all. She was patient and kind and allowed other cast members and extras to take pictures with her. Ms. Malynda Hale, “Louester”, was also wonderful. She is a very talented actress and it was wonderful working with her as well. She also made me cry on set when she was filming the funeral scene.

If you have not had a chance to see the movie – Bull Street, you should go at your first opportunity. Ms. Lynn Dow (the writer, director, producer), did an outstanding job. If you are a Summerton native,

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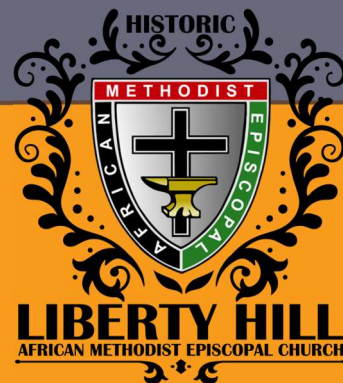
