HE WALKED OUT ...

As part of the Black History Month, Liberty Hill observed Founder's Day on Sunday, February 9. This annual celebration is part of the tradition of the African Methodist Episcopal Church to pay homage to our founder, Bishop Richard Allen, whose birthdate is reported to have been in February.

Members of the congregation participated in a presentation entitled, "HE WALKED OUT SO I COULD STAND UP!"

Richard Allen and other free African Americans living in Philadelphia attended St. George's Methodist Episcopal Church in (1791-1792). Because of the discrimination they encountered while worshipping peacefully on a regular basis, Allen and other leaders walked out of St. George's in protest one Sunday. This led to the founding of the African Methodist Episcopal Church.

Members of the congregation related the stories of well-known African Americans, focusing on how The Great Walkout influenced what they accomplished. These persons are significant in our history as African Americans and each one is/was a member of the AME Church.
