DIGITAL SIGNAGE INSTALLED



One of the goals for our 2025 Homecoming Celebration was to raise enough funds to purchase a digital sign for the front of the church. On Tuesday, July 1, our digital sign was installed.

The digital sign will allow for messages to be displayed, keeping the community informed about events and activities happening inside the

church. The digital LED sign presents Liberty Hill as an active, approachable and vibrant place of worship. Stills and videos are possible. About 8-10 messages are displayed at 4-5 second intervals to allow for drivers to see at least 3-4 messages when approaching the church from either direction.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL



Historic Liberty Hill's Vacation Bible School was held the week of June 2- 6, 2025. After weeks of prayer, planning, preparation, and publicity (by the VBS "commercial announcers" Sundays during the Sunday morning services

leading up to the big event (!)), the VBS team set off to present a time of learning, fellowship, and fun based on the theme "Magnified---Discovering the Greatness of God in the Smallest of Things" (based on Psalm 34:3 –

"O magnify the Lord with me and let us exalt His name together.")

Each evening began with a devotional period, bringing students and teachers together to set the tone. This was followed by the classes, grouped according to



ages/grade levels. Students were involved in Bible study and discussion as well as activities focusing on the creative arts (music, videos, "paint and sip," games, puzzles, inspirational coloring sheets, and tie-dying T-shirts). The teachers and staff "pulled out all the stops" to engage the learners. The wrap-up each evening was the assembling of all participants in the Fellowship Hall (which was creatively and colorfully decorated) for a review (presented by a student from each class) and a meal .



Our God is a wonder! We magnify God for who He is, for His care, for His love, for His forgiveness, and for His faithfulness! The atmosphere and the attendance were wonderful! God blessed our experience with

members of our church family, biological families, friends, neighbors, and members of our sister churches coming together...from ages 1 year old to 91 years old!

Educators Visit to Liberty Hill



On Thursday, June 19th, Dr. Bobby J. Donaldson of the University of South Carolina Center for Civil Rights History and Research visited Historic Liberty Hill. Accompanying him were educators from across South Carolina who participated in the Summer Teachers Institute funded by the National Park Service. Dr. Donaldson is a scholar of southern history and African American life and culture in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. His research and writings

explore African American intellectual thought, print culture, education and religion. He also leads the Center for Civil Rights History and Research, housed in the Hollings Special Collections Library and serves as the lead scholar for Columbia SC 63: Our Story Matters, a documentary history initiative that chronicles the struggle for civil rights and social justice in Columbia.




